INTRODUCTION

With a noticeable growth of interest in native studies in recent years, materials relevant to the study of Micmac and Maliseet cultures have been increasingly in demand. In the Archives and Special Collections section of the UNB Libraries, this includes not only published material in the form of monographs and journal articles but also manuscripts, photographs, audio-visual material and artifacts. This guide is designed to acquaint the researcher with the range of information available and draw attention to specific items which might otherwise remain undetected because of their location within other bodies of material.

Certain parameters were established to focus the guide. In order to be included, **material must be relevant to the study of Micmac or Maliseet cultures, specific to the geographical area of New Brunswick and located within Archives and Special Collections.** It was, however, quickly realized that cultures are neither isolated nor defined by political boundaries. As a result, a certain amount of flexibility was needed. Although the focus remained Micmac or Maliseet in New Brunswick, closely related material concerning Micmac in Nova Scotia, Passamaquoddy in Maine and Wabanaki in general was included.

The information for this guide was extracted from a number of sources, primarily: QUEST, the U.N.B. libraries online catalogue; the New Brunswick History Checklist, with Supplements; the Catalogue of the Maritime History Pamphlet Collection; and the inventory of manuscript holdings in Archives and Special Collections. The preliminary version of this guide was completed in the summer of 1995. With a one year hiatus before resumption of the project, it was possible to undertake a major revision and compile the index that such a lengthy inventory demanded.

DESCRIPTIVE ENTRIES

E. Tappan Adney fonds. -- 1893-1950; predominant 1940-1950. -- .875m (7 Cases).

E. Tappan Adney (1868-1950) first became interested in Maliseet culture during a vacation in Woodstock, N.B. in 1887. As a young man, he embarked on a career as an artist and journalist. His book, The Klondike Stampede of 1897-1898, was a result of his experiences in the gold rush. In the early 1930s Adney took up residence in Woodstock, the home of Adney's wife, the former Minnie Bell Sharp. Much of Adney's life was devoted to the study of Maliseet culture as a result of which he became an expert on various aspects of it, in particular the birchbark canoe and the language. His publications included "Birch-bark canoe construction" (Harper's Young People, July 29, 1890), "The Indian hunter of the far northwest" (Outing, March, 1902) and "The Malecite Indian's names for native berries and fruits, and their meanings" (Acadian Naturalist, Vol. 1, no. 3, May 1944). In the 1940s he became known as an activist for Indian rights. He died in 1950 in Woodstock, N.B.

This fonds contains largely original material documenting the long involvement of E. Tappan Adney in the affairs of native people in New Brunswick. Although his primary area of interest was Maliseet, there is also some reference to Micmac. As a long time advocate of native rights, Adney's papers are a wealth of information on treaty rights, New Brunswick court cases involving Indian rights, historical development of the reserves and the 1947 review of the Indian Act.

The following is a case level summary of the contents of this fonds. Although there is some material found in the cases which is not relevant to native people, the following description has been confined to only that portion which is.

Cases 1-2. **Treaty Rights and Related Material.** These cases contain ten inches of typescript concerning treaty rights of Maliseet and Micmac in the Maritime Provinces. Included are research notes, Adney's commentaries and typescript copies of several eighteenth century treaties.

Case 3. **Court Cases.** This case contains files compiled for three important court cases: Peter Paul (1946); Chief Silboy (1925); and Jack Polchies (1942). Peter Paul was charged with theft of wood to be used for barrel hoops. Adney was a legal advisor for the case. The file contains correspondence, letters to the editor and newspaper clippings. Silboy, Grand Chief of the Micmacs of Nova Scotia, was charged with violation of the game laws by being in possession of green pelts during closed season. The family of Jack Polchies was refused entry to Canada in violation of their right to go back and forth across the US/Canada border.

Case 4. **Transcripts on Various Topics.** Case contains 22 files of Adney's commentaries on various topics. Of particular note are the files relating to the history of reserves at Woodstock and Kingsclear. Other subjects discussed were rights of Indian veterans, canoes, languages and Belcher's Proclamation.

Case 5. **Correspondence 1937-1949.** Five inches of correspondence between Adney and various lawyers, politicians, committees and native leaders. The files contain a number of letters from Chief William Saulis of Tobique. Much of the correspondence concerns the 1947 plan of Indian Affairs to develop a central reserve at Kingsclear to replace existing reserves. There is also considerable discussion of the Peter Paul Case, conditions on reserves, the replacement of a band structure by the St. John River Tribe (Maliseet) and the treatment of Indian Veterans. Reserves at Woodstock, Kingsclear and Tobique predominate.

Case 6. **Miscellaneous.** This case contains a few issues of The Native Voice (British Columbia), 1950, Wampum (Western Ontario), 1946 and "The waning herds" (MacLean's Magazine, Jan. 1 1933 - Apr. 15 1933).

Case 7. **Government Publications.** This case contains published minutes of the Special Joint Committee of the Senate and the House of Commons appointed to continue and complete the examination and consideration of the Indian Act, 1947-1948, as well as a copy of the Indian Act

annotated by Adney.

Note that the Harriet Irving Library also holds microfilm of the E. Tappan Adney Papers which are held by the Peabody Museum. Much of the content of the microfilm is related to material in this fonds.

Bailey Family fonds. -- 1937, 1972. -- 27cm.

The Bailey Family fonds contains publications of various members of the Bailey and d'Avray families. Included is the work of Alfred Goldsworthy Bailey, a Canadian pioneer in the area of ethnohistory, with a specialization in Algonkian culture.

This fonds contains drafts and research notes for Bailey's publications Conflict of European and Eastern Algonkian cultures (1937) and Culture and Nationality (1972).

Richard Bedford Bennett fonds. -- 1928-1938; predominant 1930-1935.

As Prime Minister of Canada (1930-1935), R. B. Bennett had regular contact with the Department of Indian Affairs, as well as individuals, concerning the affairs of Canadian natives. The subject guide to Bennett's priministerial papers contains numerous references to natives. Some references are general or national in scope, but there are also specific files devoted to Indian Affairs in New Brunswick, Nova Scotia and P.E.I. The following subject headings are indicative of the range of topics: Indian Affairs (1928-1938), Indian Act (1931-1933), Indian bands (1935-1938), Indian lands (1928-1932), Indian reserves (n.d.), Indian treaties (1934-1935) and Indian education grants (n.d.). Researchers should consult the subject index to the R. B. Bennett fonds for details and locations.

Oswald Smith Crocket fonds. -- 1911-1913. -- 3cm.

Oswald Crocket (1868-1945), M.P. for York County, was first elected to the House of Commons on November 3, 1904. He resigned his seat on December 11, 1913, when he was appointed a Justice of the Supreme Court of New Brunswick.

This fonds includes 3 files of general correspondence from 1911 to 1913 concerning Crocket's constituency. Some of the correspondence from the Department of Indian Affairs reflects their involvement with reserves at Kingsclear, St. Mary's and Oromocto. Topics include medical services, especially the appointment of doctors responsible; appointment, salaries and dismissal of Indian agents; housing; construction and inspection of a school at St. Mary's reserve, and Father Ryan, superintendent of Indian schools. Of particular interest is correspondence from Chief Peter A. Paul of Kingsclear seeking to influence the appointment of a medical officer.

Vincent O. Erickson photographs. -- 1868-1974; predominant 1900-1974. -- 12.5cm.

Vincent O. Erickson was a faculty member in the Department of Anthropology at the University of New Brunswick from 1966 until his retirement. He wrote such articles as "A stratificational analysis of the Maliseet Matuwehsis story : microchange and oicotypification" (1976?), "The Malecite - Passamaquoddy" (n.d.) and "The Micmac Buoin : three centuries of cultural and semantic change" (n.d.).

This collection contains 58 black and white photographs and 212 copy negatives.

The images are primarily Maliseets from Woodstock, Tobique, St. Mary's and Kingsclear, with some Penobscot from Old Town, Maine. Included are copies made from original prints held at the New Brunswick Museum. Most of the photographs are informal portraits of individuals or small groups. Of note is a series of photos of William Sacobie of Kingsclear constructing a basket and a few photos of Peter L. Paul.

Detailed description is available.

Access: Use of negatives from prints held by the New Brunswick Museum is subject to restrictions imposed by that institution. Access is otherwise unrestricted.

Indian Affairs documents. -- 1761-1864; predominant 1800-1840. -- 12.5cm.

This collection contains 90 original documents separated, on the basis of subject matter, from a miscellaneous group of manuscripts related to early New Brunswick history which were acquired by Lord Beaverbrook. Details of origin and provenance are unknown.

Many of these documents deal with native land issues. Also included are official appointments, lists of natives in certain localities, documents concerning neutrality during the War of 1812-1814 and petitions for relief.

Of particular interest is a document appointing Nicholas Julien as chief of the Julien Tribe of Micmacs and the Treaty of Peace and Friendship established between the natives and non-natives, concluded by the Hon. Jonathan Belcher Esq., president of His Majesty's Council and Commander in Chief, and Claude Atouash, chief of the Jedaick Tribe of Indians. Correspondence from Joseph Goguen of Cocagne to Thomas Carleton and Jonathan Odell in 1800-1801 is noteworthy. There are numerous references to the Miramichi, Richibucto, Tabusintac, and Buctouche.

A chronological list, consisting of a short description and the date of the document, is available.

Indian Artifacts. -- n.d. -- 212 artifacts; 4cm of graphic material.

The University of New Brunswick Museum held a collection of Indian stone artifacts, many of which were found by Loring Woart Bailey in the 19th century, until the museum was broken up in the 1930s. At that time, some of the artifacts were retained by Alfred G. Bailey. It is those artifacts which constitute the basis of this collection.

This collection consists of 212 stone artifacts, including the complete Maquapit Lake Collection. Of special note is an unusual elbow - type pipe bowl. The artifacts were accessioned and numbered by Stuart Allen Smith in 1970. Seventy-two of these artifacts have been on loan to the York Sunbury Museum since that time.

In 1959, David Sanger photographed and classified according to form selected representative samples of the collection. There are 17 black and white photographs by David Sanger.

L. W. Bailey's Relics of the stone age in New Brunswick (reprint from the Bulletin of Natural History Society, no. VI) and a manuscript history of the artifacts by Alfred G. Bailey are included with this collection.

An item level guide to the artifacts is available. This guide indicates sites where the artifacts were found, as well as describing them. Description is also available with the photographs.

Lilian Mary Beckwith Maxwell collection. -- 1948. -- .5cm.

Dr. Lilian M. Beckwith Maxwell (1877-1956) was an author, collector and local historian. She was the author of such books as An outline of the history of Central New Brunswick to the time of confederation (1937), How New Brunswick grew (1943), The River St. John and its poets (1946) and 'Round New Brunswick roads (1951).

The Lilian Maxwell papers are a collection of manuscripts, photographs and printed material related to local history of various areas of New Brunswick. Included in the collection are two items concerning native people in New Brunswick.

Box 1, item 21: "Malecite Indian place names in the vicinity of Passamaquoddy". Translation and analysis by E. Tappan Adney. Manuscript. Attached to the manuscript is correspondence from Adney concerning his research, 1948.

Box 1, item 55: Letter from Gabriel Acquin re claim to land ownership, 1883. Typescript copy.

Andrea Bear Nicholas photographs. -- n.d. -- 12.5cm.

Andrea Bear Nicholas is a Maliseet historian and chairperson of Native Studies at St. Thomas University (1995).

Andrea Bear Nicholas collected original photographs for reproduction from the Maliseet (Tobique) area. This fonds contains 22 photographic negatives made from the original prints.

The images are largely informal portraits of Maliseet individuals with a few shots taken on religious occasions. Some description is available for the photographs, including reference to holders of the originals.

John Patterson thesis research. -- [1970]. -- 25cm.

As a student at the University of New Brunswick in the 1970s, John Patterson collected material for a thesis on "Agriculture in New Brunswick".

Although the thesis was not completed, a draft (140 pages) was deposited in the archives. The section of the thesis on Indian agriculture (5 pages) makes specific references to settlements at Meductic, Ek-pah-lak (Aupac), Madawaska, Richibucto, Burnt Church and Old Mission Point. The author discusses agriculture as practiced by Maliseets, Micmacs and Abnakis, including the growing of corn and tobacco.

Included is a box containing alphabetically arranged author and subject indexes.

Peter Lewis Paul fonds.

Peter L. Paul (1902-1989), a Maliseet from Woodstock N.B., was an expert on native culture, language and crafts. He acted as advisor, informant and friend to prominent anthropologists and linguists, as well as students of native culture in Canada and the United States. Among the many tributes paid him was an honorary Doctor of Letters from the University of New Brunswick (1970) and membership in the Order of Canada (1987). After his death, the Canadian Museum of Civilization published In Memoriam : Peter Lewis Paul, 1902-1989.

The Peter Paul fonds contains textual records, photographic and audio-visual material, and published material in the form of articles and books which reflect his long involvement with the language, history and culture of native people, Maliseet in particular. A large portion of the textual records consist of published articles and individual documents collected by Peter Paul from journals and archives during his research into the history and language of natives, especially the Maliseet. Of particular interest are files of material on reserves at Tobique, Woodstock and St. Mary's.

Paul was also very active as an advisor to both native and non-native groups. Files of minutes and related documentation from the Union of New Brunswick Indians (1985-1989), the Maine Indian Program (1985-1989), the New Brunswick Museum (1988-1989) and the New Brunswick Bicentennial Commission (1981-1983) attest to his involvement.

Working papers compiled during Paul's years of acting as an informant on the Maliseet language are an original and significant portion of the fonds.

The more than six hundred photographs deposited with this fonds depict native people in New Brunswick, 1866-1980s. The images are largely of Maliseet, mostly residents of Tobique, Woodstock and Kingsclear. Overall, portraits of individuals or small groups predominate but there are also valuable images of outdoor and craft activities. Extensive efforts were made to obtain identification. A separate inventory to the photographs is available.

The Peter Paul fonds also includes a cubic foot of audio-visual material in the form of sound recording tapes, cassettes and 35mm film. This material includes tapes produced during linguistic projects; recordings of songs and stories, mostly Maliseet; and taped interviews of individuals concerning native history and politics. Many of the later were copied from TV or radio broadcasts. A separate inventory to the audio-visual material is available.

A collection of more than two hundred books, most of which are on topics related to native studies, was deposited with this fonds. They are held as a separate 'special collection' but may be searched in QUEST, the online catalogue. The location designation is HIL-SPECP.

Gaby Pelletier basketry project. -- 1973. -- 10cm.

Gaby Pelletier is a long time student of native cultures with a particular interest in basketry. In 1973, while a student at the University of New Brunswick with anthropologist Vincent Erickson, Gaby Pelletier undertook a project to analyze and classify Maliseet splint ash baskets. She also edited and wrote an introduction for Micmac & Maliseet : decorative traditions : a catalogue featuring a selection of Maliseet and Micmac decorative arts from the collections of the New Brunswick Museum, 1977. She wrote Abenaki basketry in 1982.

Working papers for the 1973 splint ash basket project, 253 original black and white photographs of Maliseet splint ash baskets, a cassette tape and two reel to reel sound recording tapes of interviews with experts in basketry and a copy of Pelletier's essay entitled "Analysis and classification of Malecite splint ash baskets" were deposited in the archives.

The working papers give detailed technical description of each basket analyzed and photographed. The tapes are interviews with Mrs. Veronica Atwin, Peter Paul, Mrs. Oliver Polchies and Mr. & Mrs. William Sacobie. The essay discusses the historical background of basketry, construction,

classification, dating and historical trends.

Henry Harvey Stuart fonds. -- 1921-1943. -- 2.5cm.

Henry Harvey Stuart (1873-1952) had a long career as an educator, editor and political activist. He co-founded the Albert County Teachers' Union, the first in Canada. In addition to editing both the Union Advocate and the Educational Review, he played a leading role in the C.C.F. in New Brunswick. His papers include newspaper clippings, on a variety of subjects, which were bound into topical scrapbooks.

In this fonds is scrapbook #15, "N.B.-Indians" which consists of 11 pages of newspaper clippings from a variety of newspapers in New Brunswick and a few from outside the province. Most of these newspaper clippings concern Micmac but some are about Maliseet and Passamaquoddy. People of note in the clippings are Chief Pocologan, a Passamaquoddy; John Gyles and Father Pacifique. The main topics include customs and traditions, treaties, burial grounds and the history of the Passamaquoddy.

Ruth Otis (Sawtell) Wallis research papers. -- 1911-1953; predominant 1950-1953. -- 37cm.

Ruth Wallis (1886-1970) and her anthropologist husband, Wilson Wallis, were affiliated with the University of Pennsylvania. They did extensive ethnological studies of the Micmac in New Brunswick and southern Quebec. Wilson Wallis began the work alone in 1911-1912 and Ruth Wallis joined him in 1953. Their publications include Children of the Micmac and Micmac Indians of eastern Canada, 1955.

These papers include Ruth Wallis' manuscript files and 102 original black and white photographs taken during preparation of Children of the Micmac, 1950-1953, as well as 30 glass transparencies and 26 photographs and drawings, 1911-1912, used in Micmac Indians of eastern Canada. Most photographs were taken by Wilson Wallis. Field work was done at Big Cove, Indian Island, Eel Ground and Burnt Church in New Brunswick, as well as several reserves in Quebec.

The manuscript files contain raw data on pregnancy, childbirth, and various stages of childhood.

Most photographs taken for Children of the Micmac are of informants and/or their children, or buildings on the reserves. Limited description is available. The photographs and drawings done in conjunction with preparation of Micmac Indians of eastern Canada depict dress, crafts and games, in addition to portraits of individuals. Description is available.

James Dennis Wherry photographs. -- 1901-1963. -- 12.5cm.

Anthropologist James Wherry (1948-) wrote The history of Maliseets and Micmacs in Aroostook County, Maine : preliminary report number two, June 1979. He also collected and edited Documents relating to the history of the Passamaquoddy Indian presence in Charlotte County, New Brunswick in 1981.

This collection contains negatives and photocopies for 22 original photographs still held by Waneta Deveau (Bangor, Me.) and John Joseph (Houlton, Me.)

The photos are of Maliseet, mostly in Houlton, Maine. Included are both studio portraits and informal snapshots. There is also one image each of potato picking, woods work and "dress Indians" in the tourist industry.

Photographs have detailed description including family relationships and history.

Winslow Family fonds. -- 1695-1866; predominant 1783-1815.

The Winslow Family fonds is a collection of approximately 2,500 letters and other documents created or collected (1695-1866) by members of the family of Edward Winslow, (1746-1815) a Loyalist who was politically active in the separation of New Brunswick from Nova Scotia and held a number of administrative posts in the new colony. Within this correspondence there are numerous references to native affairs. Of particular significance is the 1820 document from Francis Joseph Neptune granting Campobello and nearby islands to David Owen. Researchers should consult the subject index to the Winslow fonds for details.

These papers are available on microfilm.

Section 2: Published Materials

The following catalogue entries include monographs, periodicals and newspapers which specialize in native affairs, and individual journal articles.

Entries were derived from several sources: QUEST, the U.N.B. online catalogue; the Catalogue to the Maritime History Pamphlet Collection; the New Brunswick History Checklist, with Supplements; and the Peter Paul fonds which includes several series of journal articles. A limited number of entries were made from newsclippings and photocopies of articles held in in-house files of the U.N.B. Archives.

Note: All references are to material held in Archives and Special Collections.

Note: When this inventory was compiled, some material was designated for Archives and Special Collections but had not yet been formally catalogued. Such entries are marked "See QUEST" where full cataloguing will appear.

Section 3: Index

Forward to the Subject Index

Scope

This **subject index** focuses on topics commonly requested by researchers at the Archives and Special Collections Department of the Harriet Irving Library. Both manuscript and published material were indexed. Several exceptions to standard subject access should be noted:

Geographical Location

Names of individual reserves, and occasionally other geographical areas, were indexed for the benefit of researchers whose interest was confined to a specific location.

Format

In response to the need of researchers for material in a particular format, index entries

were made to indicate newspapers, photographs and dictionaries.

Not Indexed

Material which covered a broad variety of topics on an introductory level was **not indexed**. The following is a list of items which were too diverse in content to index but nevertheless are standard works for researchers in the area of native studies:

Davis, Stephen A. - Micmac.

Erickson, Vincent O. - The Malecite-Passamaquoddy.

Jesuits. Letters from missions (North America) - The Jesuit relations and allied documents; travels and explorations of the Jesuit missionaries in New France, 1610-1791; the original French, Latin, and Italian texts, with English translations and notes; illustrated by portraits, maps, and facsimiles.

Leavitt, Robert. - The Micmacs.

Pratson, Frederick John. - Land of the four directions.

Sark, J. J. - "The Micmac".

Wallis, Wilson D. - Malecite Indians of New Brunswick.

Wallis, Wilson D. - The Micmac Indians of eastern Canada.

Wylie, E. A. - The Malecite Indians of New Brunswick.

Language

Standard English vocabulary terms were used. The spelling of common terms such as Maliseet and Glooscap, which have a multitude of variant spellings, was standardized.

Level of Indexing

Four popular areas of research: **education, religion, language and political organization**, necessitated indexing that provided access not only on the general level but also to very specific aspects of the subject.

Education

All items related to education, regardless of level or administration, were indexed under **education**. Separate index entries were added for: **native students, native teachers, day schools and specific education projects**. If the study was geographically defined, the name of the particular reserve was also indexed.

Religion

All items with reference to religious matters were indexed under the general term **religion**.

Within that major division, all material was given an added entry under either **spirituality** or **Catholicism**. Any form of traditional native belief system was indexed as **spirituality** while **Catholicism** was used as the general designation for native practice of the Christian religion.

Language

Language was an especially problematic area. Four terms were chosen to represent specific aspects of language study.

Language - items dealing in a general sense with native languages, including material designed for the basic teaching of the language.

Linguistics - material similar to that indexed under **language** but the approach is more academic or scientific.

Text - a significant portion of an item written in a native language.

Dictionaries - formal dictionaries or extensive word or phrase listings organized similarly to a dictionary, with a subdivision according to the language involved.

Political Organization

All forms and levels of political structure(s) in traditional and modern native communities were indexed under **political organization**. Specific entries were added for:

Chiefs, (roles) - when material focuses on the role of the chief within the tribal structure.

Sagamore - when reference was to a traditional chief.

Self-government - when topic was the modern movement toward transfer of control over reserves to native leaders.

Usage

In order to maintain control of index vocabulary, arbitrary definitions were assigned to certain common terms.

Land claims

Any items dealing with reserve land, including formal land claims in the legal system, and disputes over small portions of land which historically were dealt with at the local level, were indexed as **land claims**.

Storytelling/Legends

Traditional stories of a supernatural fashion which are handed down in the oral tradition were indexed as **legends**. The term **storytelling** was reserved for the relating of stories about one's friends, neighbourhood or own experiences.

Canoes/Transportation

The term **canoe** was used when the material focused on the canoe itself, in particular its construction, while material which focused on the use of canoes as a means of transportation, or canoe routes, were indexed under **transportation**.
