My dear Winslow)

I have written to you two days ago by the Sanderlane Capt. Willson in which I sent your Table Service of Crochery was sent. - There is nothing new to communicate since that time, but as Mr. B. is going in another Ship I cannot omit scribbling a line. - Genl. Fox is gone out of Town, but is to be sent for by Lord Sydney as soon as a Cabinet Council shall be held to receive the terms upon which he will accept the Government of New Ireland, which will probably be in a week or ten days. - I find it is doubtful whether there will be any Governor General, unless Sir Guy Carleton will go out - but it seems fixed beyond all doubt that Genl. Fox will be the Governor at St. Johns & Judge Ludlow Chief Justice, no other part of the arrangement is yet determined upon but I begin to feel very anxious about my own situation
